COLORADO SYMPHONY ANNOUNCES ENTIRE 2017/18 CONCERT SCHEDULE FOR BRETT MITCHELL'S DEBUT SEASON AS MUSIC DIRECTOR WITH SPECIAL CONCERT BY YO-YO MA

Mar. 1, 2017 – Denver, CO – The Colorado Symphony announces its full 2017/18 Concert Season schedule taking place at downtown Denver's Boettcher Concert Hall. This historic season features renowned guest artists and some of the world's most revered symphonic works as the Colorado Symphony celebrates Brett Mitchell's debut as Music Director. Notably, world-famous cellist Yo-Yo Ma will perform with Mitchell and the Symphony on Sunday, Dec. 10, 2017, at 7:30 p.m.

Mitchell will conduct the Colorado Symphony with Mr. Ma in December, with famed soprano Renée Fleming on Sep. 9, 2017, and will open the Classics series (formerly "Masterworks") with an Opening Weekend on Sep. 15 – 17, 2017, featuring Beethoven's revered Symphony No. 5 and works by living composers Kevin Puts and symphonic-electronica artist Mason Bates.

"For our first season together, I wanted to celebrate what makes the Colorado Symphony absolutely unique among orchestras: an extraordinarily wide variety of concerts that feature a compelling blend of old and new, all performed by some of the finest musicians in the country," says Music Director Designate Brett Mitchell, who assumes the role of Music Director on Jul. 1, 2017. "Of course, we're thrilled to welcome such special guests as Yo-Yo Ma and Renée Fleming, but I'm every bit as excited to showcase my incredible colleagues that make up the Colorado Symphony as we share the stage together all season long. I couldn't be happier to begin this next chapter in the Colorado Symphony story!"

"With Brett coming onboard, this is a huge year that deserves huge names," says Chief Artistic Officer Anthony Pierce. "Other exciting changes are happening this season, too. We're breathing new life into some our programming, including a totally revamped concert-plus-talk-through series called LISTEN/HEAR. It's essentially a performance threaded with narratives, taking the audience through the eras of symphonic music from Baroque to today's composers."

Subscription tickets for the 2017/18 Season, which are pre-set packages based on concert series, go on sale today, Mar. 1, 2017. Flex Passes are also on sale as of Mar. 1, which offer (6) ticket vouchers guests can use for best-available seats to any concert in the season, redeemable one week before the selected concert.
