Colorado Symphony Trustee Diane Hill to receive prestigious Margaret Phipps Award

Feb. 4, 2019 – Denver, CO – The Colorado Symphony announces the 2019 Colorado Symphony Ball, *Speak Easy Rock Hard*, to be held on Saturday, April 6, 2019, at 6:00 p.m. at Denver's historic Fillmore Auditorium. The Colorado Symphony is honored to welcome Byron & Lisa Haselden, Chris & Teresa Murdy, JJ Rams & Karen Hatley, Christopher J. Ott and Jeremy Simons, Amy Harmon, and Marcela de la Mar as event co-chairs, and Governor Jared Polis, First Gentleman Marlon Reis, Mayor Michael B. Hancock, and First Lady Mary Louise Lee as honorary co-chairs for an evening of Prohibition Era excitement.

Local rock band, The Originators, founded by Haselden Construction Chairman Ed Haselden, will rock the Fillmore along with the Colorado Symphony's full orchestra. Haselden has been performing on behalf of local charities throughout Denver for many years and was also a co-founder of The Moderators. Music Director Brett Mitchell will conduct the Colorado Symphony throughout the evening's festivities.

Mistress of Ceremonies for the evening will be 9NEWS' own Kim Christiansen. The event will include a cocktail hour, silent and live auction, dinner, concert, dancing, and the presentation of the Margaret Phipps Award. The prestigious Margaret Phipps Award, established in 1993, recognizes outstanding contributions and service to the Colorado Symphony and the arts community. This year's recipient is Colorado Symphony Trustee Diane Hill. Diane has served the organization in multiple capacities including being Co-Chair of the Advancement Committee and Chair of the Women of Note.

"The Colorado Symphony Ball is the can't-miss event of the year, bringing together over 800 philanthropic guests, incredible music, and a packed dance floor," says John Burtness, Chief Advancement Officer. "As a nonprofit organization, the Ball is vital to our annual fundraising efforts. Last year's event raised approximately \$1 million in contributed funds, helping to make all of our season's programming, community engagement, and education initiatives possible."
