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COLORADO SYMPHONY ANNOUNCES SOPRANO RENÉE FLEMING FOR MUSIC DIRECTOR BRETT MITCHELL'S INAUGURAL CONCERT AND FIRST CONCERT OF 2017/18 SEASON

November 21, 2016 – Denver, CO – Today the Colorado Symphony announces a one-night performance of internationally revered soprano Renée Fleming at Boettcher Concert Hall on Saturday, Sep. 9, 2017, at 7:30 p.m. This performance will be the first concert of the Symphony's 2017/18 Season, and the first to be conducted by Brett Mitchell as he assumes his role as the Colorado Symphony's Music Director. The concert repertoire is to be announced.

Known as "the people's diva" and described as having "the most sheerly beautiful soprano voice on the planet" by the UK Telegraph, Ms. Fleming won the 2013 Grammy® Award for Best Classical Vocal Solo and was awarded the National Medal of Arts at a White House ceremony in 2013—America's highest honor for an individual artist.

Ms. Fleming has hosted a wide variety of television and radio broadcasts, including the Metropolitan Opera's Live in HD series for movie theaters and television and Live From Lincoln Center on PBS. She is also the first classical artist to sing the National Anthem at the Super Bowl.

Brett Mitchell, who is currently Associate Conductor at the Cleveland Orchestra and Music Director of the Cleveland Orchestra Youth Orchestra, made national news when he was appointed as the Colorado Symphony's Music Director Designate for the 2016/17 Season in September 2016. Mitchell officially begins his tenure as the Colorado Symphony's Music Director on Jul. 1, 2017.

"Just when I thought the kickoff to our time together at the Colorado Symphony couldn't get any more exciting, there it is: special guest artist Renée Fleming," said Mitchell. "Renée is simply one of the greatest singers of all time, and we've known each other since working together on a world premiere in Paris back in 2009. I couldn't be more honored or thrilled to have her join us for my first official concert as Music Director of the Colorado Symphony next September."

Tickets will go on sale to the general public on Thursday, Dec. 1, 2016, 10 a.m. MST, and will be available at <u>coloradosymphony.org/tickets</u>, or by visiting or calling the box office at 303.623.7876.
