IMAGINATION ARTIST SERIES RETURNS WITH ALL NEW PERFORMANCES FEATURING RZA, MARY-MITCHELL CAMPBELL, AND NATHANIEL RATELIFF

Raekwon joins RZA for an orchestral reinvention of the classic hip-hop album Only Built 4 Cuban Linx...;

Mary-Mitchell Campbell brings the flavor of California to Denver with a Celebration of Laurel Canyon;

Nathaniel Rateliff returns to Boettcher Concert Hall honoring the legendary Leonard Cohen.

Dec. 6, 2023 – Denver, CO – Announcing the next chapter in the Colorado Symphony's Imagination Artist Series featuring brand new collaborations with RZA, Nathaniel Rateliff, and Mary-Mitchell Campbell. RZA will be joined by fellow Wu-Tang Clan founder Raekwon for a symphonic reinvention of the classic hip-hop album *Only Built 4 Cuban Linx...* at Boettcher Concert Hall on February 16 and 17, 2024. On March 15 and 16, 2024, Broadway darling Mary-Mitchell Campbell brings the flavor of California to Denver with a celebration of the songwriters of Laurel Canyon featuring the return of Broadway performer Jessica Vosk. And hometown hero Nathaniel Rateliff returns to Boettcher Concert Hall on April 5 and 6, 2024, for a tribute to legendary singer/songwriter Leonard Cohen. Rateliff's performance will open with a set featuring Phil Cook on solo piano.

RZA PRESENTS ONLY BUILT 4 CUBAN LINX... WITH RAEKWON AND THE COLORADO SYMPHONY:

Only Built 4 Cuban Linx... is a landmark hip-hop album released by rapper Raekwon who rose to prominence as a founding member of the Wu-Tang Clan. Produced by fellow Wu-Tang Clan founder RZA, this record is a cornerstone of East Coast hip-hop and a quintessential piece of the genre's golden era, thanks in part to RZA's extraordinary beats and the introduction of Raekwon and Ghostface Killah as a legendary rap duo. With its gritty storytelling, intricate lyricism, and cinematic production, *Cuban Linx* offers listeners a vivid glimpse into the street life of 1990s New York City. Together with the Colorado Symphony, this legendary duo will reimagine their timeless album that continues to inspire and shape the sound of contemporary hip-hop today.

CALIFORNIA DREAMIN': THE MUSIC OF LAUREL CANYON WITH MARY-MITCHELL CAMPBELL AND THE COLORADO SYMPHONY:

Step into the enchanting sun-soaked hills of California's Laurel Canyon with Mary-Mitchell Campbell and vocalist Jessica Vosk. Originally conceived by Campbell and Vosk, California Dreamin' highlights the inspiring California songwriters of the 1960s and '70s, whose beautiful harmonies and enduring lyrics formed the soundtrack to the West Coast pop sound that defined an era. As the lights dim and the first notes fill the air, audiences will be transported to a time when Joni Mitchell, Neil Young, David Crosby, Linda Ronstadt, John Phillips and The Mamas & the Papas, and the Eagles' Don Henley and Glenn Frey reigned supreme, shaping the musical landscape with their timeless melodies and trailblazing songwriting. Mary-Mitchell Campbell, a masterful conductor and arranger, leads world-renowned vocalist Jessica Vosk and the Colorado Symphony through a carefully curated selection of hits that defined an era and captivated hearts across the globe.

NATHANIEL RATELIFF PRESENTS A NIGHT OF LEONARD COHEN WITH THE COLORADO SYMPHONY:

One of the most fascinating and enigmatic singer/songwriters of the late '60s, Leonard Cohen developed a massive following across six decades of music-making, interrupted by various digressions into personal and creative exploration, all of which have only added to the mystique surrounding him. A master wordsmith with a voice like aged whiskey and lyrics that cut to the core of humanity, Cohen's artistry transcends generations, weaving tales of love, longing, and spirituality that continue to resonate. Denver singer and songwriter Nathaniel Rateliff joins the Colorado Symphony, blending his folk, Americana, and vintage rhythm & blues influences with Cohen's timeless lyrics for a collaboration six decades in the making. From "Hallelujah" to "Suzanne," witness the power of songwriting to touch the deepest recesses of the soul.
