Jul. 24, 2025 – Denver, CO – The Colorado Symphony today announced that the much-anticipated concert featuring Tony Award® winners Sutton Foster and Kelli O'Hara, originally scheduled for November 15, 2025, has been rescheduled to **Thursday, February 26, 2026**, at the Boettcher Concert Hall.

Due to unforeseen scheduling conflicts with theatrical commitments, the Colorado Symphony is rescheduling the show to ensure Ms. Foster and Ms. O'Hara can fully commit their time and energy to deliver an unforgettable performance.

Ticketing Information

All tickets purchased for the original date on November 15, 2025, will be honored for the rescheduled date on February 26, 2026.
